ePortfolios are great tools for supporting lifelong, self-directed learning.

Use your ePortfolio to showcase your skills, education and accomplishments to potential employers, graduate schools, or for class presentations.

The basic idea is that you add to your ePortfolio as you go through your studies. Add resources that you are proud of such as course reports, assignments, images, blogs, videos or audio recordings. When you have these resources collected, reflect on your learning and skills and set goals for the next stage of your learning. You might want to form a group of friends to share parts of your ePortfolio and exchange feedback. In the process of developing an e-portfolio, you will see the progression in your learning.



- Link the skills and experiences you develop in courses and postgraduate research
- · Collect and store resources in a single place
- · Review your course content and progress
- Learn by reflecting on what you have done using the evidence of your coursework and assignments
- Link the research skills you develop and showcase your research to others
- Give others an insight into your studies at university by showing examples of your work and share how you understand the material
- Develop self assessment skills and experiences
- Plan where and how to further develop your skills
- Showcase evidence of your experience to employers
